Key vocabulary

Point and sweep — terminology used to point to each phoneme as we sweep to blend the word.

Chunking — splitting a word into smaller decodable parts before blending as a whole.

Digraph 2 letters which make one sound/ trigraph 3 letters which make one sound.

Characters, Expression, Author, Illustrator, predict, settings.
