### COVID-19 Update

The following is information we have received from East Riding of Yorkshire Council regarding advice on living with COVID-19.

- If a pupil or member of staff has symptoms of a respiratory infection, such as COVID-19, and they have a high temperature or do not feel well enough to come to school/work or carry out normal activities, they are advised to stay at home and avoid contact with other people until 24 hours after they no longer have a high temperature.
- It is not recommended that children and young people are tested for COVID-19 unless directed to by a health professional.
- If a child or young person has a positive COVID-19 test result or displays symptoms including high temperature, fever or chills, they should stay at home and avoid contact with other people for 3 days after the day they took the test. At the end of this period, if the individual has a high temperature or feels unwell, they should continue to stay at home and avoid contact with other people until 24 hours after they no longer have a high temperature and they feel well enough to resume normal activities. After 3 days, if they feel well and do not have a high temperature, the risk of passing the infection on to others is much lower. This is because children and young people tend to be infectious to other people for less time than adults.
- Children and young people who usually go to school, college or childcare and who live with someone who has a positive COVID-19 test result should continue to attend as normal.

#### Swanland School Uniform Reminder

We have noticed that there are a few children coming to school in incorrect school uniform. It is not necessary to have school branded uniform (including PE kit), however, all uniform should adhere to our policy:

- White or navy polo shirt
- Dark navy jumper/sweatshirt/cardigan
- Dark navy or grey trousers/shorts (shorts should be at least mid-thigh length and trousers and shorts should not be of a tight stretchy material) or
- Navy skirt/pinafore dress/culottes (skirts should be knee length and not of a tight stretchy material)
- Plain dark navy tights or white, navy, black or grey plain socks
- In the Summer Term, children may wear blue gingham summer dresses (not half white, half check option)

The PE kit is:

- Sky blue round neck T-shirt
- Plain dark navy-blue shadow stripe shorts
- For outdoor PE children may wear black, navy or grey plain jogging bottoms and sweatshirt and should have appropriate trainers.

## Use of the Drop-Off and Pick-Up Zone in the Morning and After School

We have been made aware of several issues with the misuse of the drop-off and pick-up zone, both in the morning and after school, by a small minority of people, so we felt it was timely to send a reminder of the correct use of this area. Please pass on these messages to the person who drops off and picks up your child at school.

The drop-off and pick-up zone is recommended for children in <u>Years 3-6</u> who are able to use the zone independently.

<u>Under no circumstances must cars park in this area</u>. Please do not try to turn around on Tranby Lane (3-point turn), please be courteous and let each other through without mounting the kerb.

• In The Morning:

Please use this area to pull up and let your child out and then move away promptly and carefully.

<u>After School:</u>

Please arrive shortly after 3.20 pm to ensure your child has had time to get out of school and to the pick-up area. <u>Please do not wait and do not leave your car unattended</u>. This is where the majority of the problems occur, with cars aueuing up around the corner onto Kemp Road and causing problems and potential accidents for other traffic. If your child is not there when you get to the front of the aueue, <u>please drive around the block</u> <u>and return to pick up your child</u>.
