Year 5 - 'Portals to the Past' visitor - Thursday 9th June 2022

Our new topic this term is Ancient Greece. We would love to use this as a reason to go on a school trip to Greece ... however, we have gone for the next best thing! We are inviting a company into school to take us back in time!



On Thursday 9th June, a team of performing historians will be coming into school for the full day. They will be leading a fun, exciting and fact filled day.

GREEK WORKSHOP 'RUNDOWN'

A mixture of activities, role play, artefacts and fun really will bring this subject alive! From the warring city states, the birth of democracy and Greek legends, to Alexander the Great and Greek culture. The day will start with a short talk on Greek life and culture and the Battles of Thermopylae and Marathon, followed by four activities.

MYTHS AND LEGENDS

The children will then be transported to a Greek theatre, where they will take part in re-enacting Greek myths and legends. After lunch, a Greek warrior fresh from battle will demonstrate his weapons and armour. The differences between the city states of Athens and Sparta are explored and the children will take a lesson in democracy. If Athens wins, they will hold their own mini—Olympic Games. But if Sparta wins, they must join the Spartan Agoge to become warriors ... The great battle of Gaugamela between Alexander the Great and King Darius will then finish the afternoon!

There will be the option for dressing up, we will be in touch soon with more information about this.
