Predicted Heatwave and Events Planned for Monday 18th and Tuesday 19th July 2022

As you will be aware, in recent days much of the country has been experiencing increasingly high temperatures. The Met Office has issued an amber weather warning for most of England and parts of Wales, with exceptionally high temperatures expected from Sunday and the weather conditions looking to last into early next week.

Owing to this extreme heat warning, for the health, safety and wellbeing of the children, we are rescheduling the Year 1/2 Sports Day and the Year 6 Summer Games Event to later in the week, when it will be cooler.

The children will have a shorter time outside at break and lunchtime on Monday and Tuesday and, depending on the heat, will be encouraged not to run around too much. Activities will be planned for the children to do inside, where it will be cooler. They will be encouraged to drink water regularly to prevent dehydration, so please do remember to send your child with a water bottle. We advise you apply a high SPF sun cream to your child before they come to school and to send them in with a sun hat (preferably with a wide brim). Thank you.
