Dear Parent/Carer (Year 6)



PTA Summer Festival 2022 – Year 6 Summer Games Stalls!

6.00–9.30 pm on Friday 15th July 2022 at Swanland Primary School

We have had some enquiries about the Year 6 games not being offered on Friday evening at the Summer Festival this year and, instead, being held during the afternoon on Tuesday 19th July.

The main reason for this is so that all Year 6 children have the opportunity to participate in running their Games Stall even if they are unable to attend the Festival. It also allows all the children in the rest of the school to be able to participate. In addition to this, owing to a lack of adult volunteers at the Festival, the Year 6 teachers had been allocated jobs on PTA stalls and, therefore, were not able to supervise the Year 6 stalls.

Specifically, the queries we have received were regarding the lack of activities for children at the Festival and noting that some Year 6 children would be attending the Festival anyway and, therefore, would still be able to offer their Games Stalls.

With this in mind, if there are any Year 6 children who still wish to run their Games Stall on Friday evening, as well as running it on Tuesday afternoon, we will make arrangements for them to do so (staff have kindly agreed to give up more of their time to facilitate this). If your child still wishes to run their stall with their group members, then please send your child's class teacher a SeeSaw message and they will be allowed to set up their stall on Friday afternoon. On Friday evening, gates will open at 5.45 pm for the Year 6 children and all Year 6 stalls will be packed up and the children ready to be collected by 8.30 pm.

We do hope that you understand that we are trying to reach a compromise that will suit everyone and apologise for this last-minute change to arrangements.
