





Little Wandle phonics

We will be following the Little Wandle phonics scheme. Your child will bring home 4 sounds per week to practise at home.

Activities to do at home

Can you practise your little blue sound book everyday? Can be a diagraph/ trigraph spotter? Can you use your segmenting fingers to write little words?

Key vocabulary

Phoneme- unit of sound within a word

Grapheme- (a written symbol which represents a sound)

Pronunciation — how to say the word correctly considering the position of lips, tongue teeth

Point and sweep — terminology used to point to each phoneme as we sweep to blend the word

Diagraph 2 letters which make one sound

Trigraph 3 letters which make one sound
