Here's some trivia about Swanland to help you get started:

- Swanland is named after the swans and its cygnets which are known to live in Swanland's pond. Bewick and Mute swans can be spotted here
- Little Grebe's are frequently spotted in the area by local birdwatchers
- Swanland Hall was once owned by The Todd family, whose patronage is said to have greatly benefitted the village. They remained owners of the Hall until 1926
- Other former owners of Swanland Hall include Eustace de Vesci in the 13th Century and Haldenby in the 16th Century

- Thomas Blossom is attributed as giving a fantastic account of what life was like growing up in Swanland in Georgian times. He also served in Charles I parliamentary army
- Swanland was once served by two windmills – Ferriby Mill (in Ferriby) and later its own Mill. It was historically a farming village, so the windmill was an important facility
