Continent	A large area of land, separated from other land by natural features.
Rockies	The largest mountain system in North America.
Great Plains/Prairies	A large area of flatland in North America.
Great Lakes	Five large lakes in eastern North America.
Canadian Shield	The exposed portion of the Continental Crust underlying most of North America.
Coastal Strip	A strip of land extending along the coast.

Regional Landscapes and Climate

North and South America extend from near the North Pole, across the Tropic of Cancer, Equator and Tropic of Capricorn, and almost to Antarctica and the South Pole, so the weather and climate is very varied. The landscapes are therefore varied including tropical, mountainous, dense wilderness and deserts.

Route 66

It was established on November 11th 1926, as one of the original highways in the US Highway System. It became one of the most famous roads in the United States. Road signs were put up in 1927. It originally ran from Chicago to Santa Monica stretching 2,448 miles.

Characteristics of Cities
