Consequences

There were good and bad consequences to the fire.

It gave the chance for London to be improved wider streets, more brick and stone buildings, overhanging buildings and hanging signs were banned, better access to water.

6 people died, 13 thousand buildings destroyed, 87 churches destroyed, almost 10 thousand people were made homeless, businesses destroyed so people lost their jobs.
