Year 6 Residential Visit to Cober Hill, Scarborough

Tuesday 2nd July to Friday 5th July 2024 – Deposit to Pay: £55.00

It is with pleasure that we are able to write with information regarding the above exciting visit, which will hopefully take place from Tuesday 2nd to Friday 5th July 2024. **To secure your child's place a non-refundable deposit of £55.00 per child should be paid by Wednesday 18th October 2023.**

We will be staying at Cober Hill – a beautiful Victorian hotel set in 11 acres of gardens and meadows (located 6 miles north of Scarborough and 12 miles south of Whitby).

Here are just some of the exciting activities which we hope to include in this residential visit:

- North York Moors Railway
- Discover Goathland and the station made famous by the Harry Potter films
- Discover Whitby
- Dalby Forest – shelter building and orienteering
- Danby Lodge – geocaching and animal habitat/ecosystems

The deposit of £55.00 for this visit is now on the [ParentPay](#) website for you to pay online in the usual way by Wednesday 18th October 2023. As you are now able to give consent on [ParentPay](#) you no longer need to return a paper permission slip to school. Should you require a paper permission slip, please contact the School Office.

*NB Numbers will have to be confirmed with the coach company and each of the attractions concerned, therefore, **WE WILL BE UNABLE TO MAKE CHANGES TO NUMBERS AFTER THE DEPOSIT DEADLINE.***

The final cost is yet to be confirmed but, as a guide, we anticipate this to be around £295.00. Please note, the price will include transport, all meals and all activities and these are yet to be finalised; this figure is only an approximation.

Once numbers and final costs are confirmed, we will write again in January asking for the remaining payment. The balance will then be available to pay on [ParentPay](#) and may be paid in instalments up until the final payment deadline (date to be confirmed).
