North American landscape and Cities

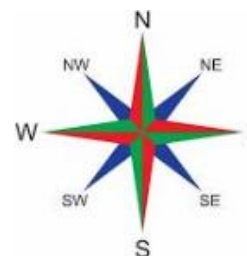
North America is one of the 7 continents. It has 50 states in total. Each states has cities and also smaller towns. Some states are: Illinois and New York State

South America is one of the 7 continents. It is divided into 12 independent states or countries, Including : Argentina, Bolivia, Chile and Brazil, Peru and Paraguay.

Amazon River and Rain Forest

The Amazon River is nearly 4,000 miles long. The amazon Rainforest is the world largest tropical rainforest. It spans over 9 different countries.

River Humber and Woodlands

The River Humber is 37 miles long. You can cross the river using the Humber Bridge. It is home to many species of flora and fauna including: fish, otters, birds, insects and trees.

Climate and animals in the UK

The UK's climate is middling. Fauna that can be found in the wild include: deer, badgers, foxes, rabbits, mice, birds and hedgehogs. Flora includes: Oak, Acorn and Ash trees, Snow Drops, Foxgloves and Primroses.
