Reading

Reading -

Your child will bring home one reading book each week to read at home and a sharing book to enhance reading for pleasure.

Some of the children will be taking part in the Little Wandle scheme to further develop their phonic knowledge and fluency and e-books will be issued. Children will undertake a fluency test — we listen to them read a passage of text in one minute. We are looking at how accurately and fluently they can read in this time. Using these results some children will be using the Phase 5 books. The children are re-assessed every few weeks and will move onto the banded books when ready.

Some children will be bringing home the banded reading books.

The Home School Reading Record has three sections each week for you to sign that you have read with your child.

The expectation is for the child to read at least three times a week and to be responsible for returning their books each Monday for changing.

Remember to read with your child and try and factor in some family reading time because if children see you reading it will help inspire them to be readers and read for pleasure.

Reading record — this needs to be signed each time you hear your child read/share a reading experience.

Reading skills are a vital part of the Literacy curriculum.

Pupils will take part in reading skills lesson to enhance things such as expression, emotion, intonation, prediction and inference.

Writing

As a school, we implement the principles of Talk for Writing during writing tasks. This means pupils complete a 'cold write' and then work on areas of improvement before completing a 'hot write'. This is an up-levelled piece of work showing improvements on initial 'cold write'.

The writing is assessed by the teacher and marked according to the school marking policy.

After each session pupils will be given verbal feedback to 'up-level' their work by a member of staff.

Each Friday the children will write a diary entry, this will be sent home for you to see weekly progress in your child's writing. You are invited to write back to your child, this is to be returned back to school before the following Friday. At the end of the year you will get your child's diary back.



Writing - Teacher Assessment

- KS1 Writing assessment is based on writing produced in all areas of the curriculum — not just Literacy
- Pupils will complete a regular writing task and this will be linked to the topic.



Mastery Maths

Our teaching is bespoke to individual needs, whilst following the White Rose Curriculum. We spend longer on our topics so that the children have a deeper understanding.







Maths Reasoning NFER Program

Mathematical Reasoning (MR) is a 12 to 15-week programme developed by the University of Oxford for pupils in Year 2. The programme aims to improve mathematical attainment by developing pupils' understanding of the logical principles underlying mathematics. The Education Endowment Foundation (EEF) is funding the National Foundation for Educational Research (NFER) to evaluate the MR programme, which is delivered by the Year 2 teachers with support from the University of Oxford.

Science and Foundation subjects

Foundation national curriculum subjects, including Geography, History, Art, Design and Technology, RE, Music and Computing, will be assessed by your child's teacher based on their work throughout the year.

At the start of our lessons we use a Connect activity to link their learning to the previous lesson, or to a topic previously taught. The children then carry out activities and finish with a Demonstrate activity, to demonstrate their understanding.



PE
