**Reception – Visit to the Normanby Hall Country Park**

**Class RHM on Tuesday 17<sup>th</sup> June 2025 and Class RCM on Thursday 19<sup>th</sup> June 2025**

It is proposed that the Reception children will visit Normanby Hall Country Park as part of their science and literacy topic, 'Minibeasts', on Tuesday 17<sup>th</sup> June (Class RHM) and Thursday 19<sup>th</sup> June (Class RCM). Normanby Hall Country Park is a beautiful 300-acre estate set in the heart of North Lincolnshire.

As the children will be walking through woods etc, Normanby Park staff have advised us that the children should keep their arms and legs covered, i.e. wear long sleeves and trousers. The children may come in non-uniform but we kindly request that they wear their school jumper or cardigan. Depending on the weather, the children should wear trainers or wellington boots and a warm waterproof coat. If it is sunny that day, would you please ensure your child has had sun cream applied **BEFORE** he/she comes to school and brings a sun hat to wear.

The children will leave school at 9.30 am. They will leave Normanby Hall at 2.15 pm and should arrive back at Swanland Primary School (traffic permitting) by the end of the school day; please collect your child as usual from the playground. Thank you.

We offer the option of a free packed lunch on school trip days to those children who are eligible for Universal Infant Free School Meals (EYFS and KS1). A school packed lunch consists of a sandwich on brown bread with sunflower spread, a piece of fruit, a biscuit and a bottle of still water. This is not compulsory; your child may bring their own packed lunch if you prefer (no glass bottles please). To ensure we are aware of all requests for packed lunches on the day, may we please request that **ALL PARENTS** complete this link even if you do not require a school packed lunch) before 9.00 am on Tuesday 3<sup>rd</sup> June 2025 at the latest – thank you. Please also indicate on the link whether you give permission for your child to have an ice-lolly.

As a school we work to ensure that the costs of all our visits are minimised, so that as many children as possible can take advantage of these valuable learning experiences. In this case, to be able to offer the visit, we are requesting a contribution of £27.40 per child (this includes an ice-lolly). If the level of contributions fails to cover the costs, then the visit may be cancelled. Where this happens, all monies will be returned.
